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


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

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# Fly-in Fishing

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For generations, the bushplane has transported anglers, intrepid explorers, eager prospectors and thrill-seekers into the heart of Northern Ontario's untamed lakes. Even today, the bushplane remains the only way to access many of Algoma's most coveted fishing lakes.

The quintessential Canadian adventure should be on every angler's bucket list. Flying into a remote lake means travelling to a place where few have ventured. The options are limitless – from selecting backcountry outpost cabins to a full-service luxury lodge.

Imagine the exhilaration of a seamless takeoff from the water, swiftly ascending where clouds frame the sky and the breathtaking view of the landscape below that can only be seen from the air. The number one reason to choose this type of trip is to experience spectacular fishing in solitude and the peacefulness of the wild.

Regional air services fly out of Wawa, White River, Hornepayne, Hawk Junction, Chapleau, Foleyet, Nakina, Armstrong, Hearst, Algoma Mills, Elliot Lake, or Blind River. 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
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# Remote Outposts

Different air services may have different weight limits and baggage restrictions.

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# Train-in Fishing


## RIDE THE RAILS

Are you looking for a remote fishing adventure minus the flight? There are full-service lodges located along the VIA Rail line in Algoma Country, each providing an experience as unique as its location. Various departure points make this experience accessible from communities in the North.

With options to choose, you can prepare your meals in a self-catering cabin, or relish in a full American Plan, complete with lodge-prepared meals and daily cabin upkeep. It's the perfect situation for anglers and outdoor enthusiasts.

These lodges along the rail line provide fishing tales for northern pike, walleye, whitefish, perch, lake trout, and brook trout. Picture a shore lunch, the reward after a morning's fishing adventure. When the reel grows heavy, these lodges extend nature exploration opportunities inviting you to paddle serene waters by kayak or canoe, unveiling the tranquil secluded lakes. # FISH THE NORTH

## PLANES! TRAINS! AUTOMOBILES!

When it comes to adventure, there is no shortage here in Northern Ontario. And who doesn't love an adventure? Exploring remote backcountry locations for fish that know nothing of humans - it's a special, special thing. And it's a thing myself and my podcast co-host Aldo Pescatore have gotten to do. Like, a lot. Growing up, we dreamt of exploring this massive province we call home. Little did we know one day we'd explore it in every possible way. From drive-in destinations, to train-in lodges, and fly-in outpost camps, it's been a wild ride, baby.



If you're also looking for a thrill, keep reading. I'll quickly break down some options we've loved from over the years.

## DRIVE IN TO EPIC FISHING

When people think 'epic fishing' they think remote, inaccessible locations. There's some truth to that for sure, but this province is WILDLY big. There are TONS of places you can drive to easily, and experience untouched wilderness.

On one specific drive-in trip we explored the Whalesback Channel of Lake Huron - SO, big water, big fish. Smallmouth was our target species when we visited, and we got into some tanks. On another drive-in trip we found ourselves chasing both musky and bass - got some nice smallmouth, and one small (but mighty) musky. Still, was our buddies first musky so that was sweet! But we've also done drive-in spots for walleye, pike, trout, salmon and steelhead. Algoma rules.



## TRAIN TO REMOTE WATER

Looking to leave the car at home? Ride the rails into a rugged landscape. We took the train from White River into a remote lodge and fished a lake full of pike and walleye. It's super unique, taking the train in, and the vibes riding in are next level. Sort of feels like stepping back in time, and taking an adventure from the past. Definitely recommend this approach to Algoma exploration.



## FLY INTO BIG ADVENTURE

Ontario is the land of the bush plane. We've got some epic flight services across Algoma - all amazing. We've flown with many of them to different destinations around the province. There is NOTHING better than loading up a float plane to head into truly remote locations - you feel 'out there', and the fishing is almost always incredible because of that. Pack lighter than normal - there are weight restrictions. But you will find no finer fishing than fishing accessed by air.



Bottom line, go explore Northern Ontario. It's such a special and unique place, and if you're keen on adventure - GO! It's impossible to see it all, but you should try. Because around every bend, at the end of every portage, you never know what you'll find. But it'll be amazing.





# Fly Fishing

## A FLY FISHER'S PARADISE

The Algoma region is the Ontario hot spot for wilderness fly fishing. You can fly into remote lodges or take the train. If you want pure solitude, many operators offer outposts with cabins on remote lakes. There are also drive-in lodges with cottages offering the convenience of parking right outside your door. You can even fly fish for salmon and steelhead right in the heart of Sault Ste. Marie.

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# Hunting



## HUNT BIG OR SMALL GAME

Numerous Algoma resorts, lodges, and remote fly-in camps transition into specialized seasonal hunt camps with experienced guides. These hunting lodges serve as the designated hosts for non-resident moose and bear hunters, ensuring eligibility for hunting licences. Hunting experiences include small game, wildfowl, and big game.

The spring black bear hunt in Algoma runs from May 1st to June 15th. The fall bear hunt begins in mid-August, while the pursuit of small game, wildfowl, and game species such as moose and deer, extends from mid-September through mid-December.

Did you know that Algoma Country is over three times the size of the State of Vermont? For those of you looking for a weekend motorcycle ride, it's time to ride Highway 129. This stretch of road has spectacular scenery and is renowned for curves as it hugs the banks of the Mississagi River. Part of the Grand Algoma Tour, Highway 129 links up to Highway 101 at Chapleau which takes you to Highway 17 at Wawa. This trip is ideal for any mode of travel. Experience one of the Top Ten Drives in Canada: Wawa to Sault Ste. Marie. There are so many opportunities to stop and photograph the scenery along Lake Superior.

## RIDE LAKE SUPERIOR

Are you ready for it? Three states, one province and this immense lake make for a wicked road trip. Follow Hwy 17 from Wawa to White River, detour Hwy 519 to Dubreuilville then to Hwy 631 to Hornepayne and connect at Hwy 11 to Hearst.



Starting in Sault Ste. Marie, this day loop around St. Joseph Island is a must-do. Touring on the island and along the North Channel is unique and there's very little traffic on the country roads. ## DEER TRAIL TOUR

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


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# Boating

## WHEN ROAD MEETS THE WILD

There's a moment, just north of Sault Ste. Marie, where the highway crests a hill and Lake Superior erupts into view — vast, steel-blue, and untamed. The road bends along its shoreline, forests press close, and suddenly you realize: Algoma isn't a destination, it's an experience.

Over the years, I've returned to Algoma again and again. Sometimes in a car with the family, sometimes behind the wheel of an RV, other times on two wheels — both motorized and not. I've even seen it blanketed in snow from the seat of a snowmobile. Each journey revealed a different side of this Northern Ontario gem.

## TOURING BY RV

If you are looking for more nights under Superior's stars an RV is the answer. Waking up in Lake Superior Provincial Park, with Superior stretching beyond the window, was worth every kilometre. Evenings meant cooking dinner as the sun dipped behind the trees, nights ended by the fire, listening to loons call. RVing slows Algoma down. Instead of rushing to the next town, you linger by the lake or in the forest.

Planning is simple. Combine the 682 km (424 mi) Grand Algoma Tour with the 120 km (72 mi) Deer Trail Tour loop for a ready-to-go adventure.



## TOURING BY CAR

Freedom to stop at every lookout. My first Algoma trip was the classic road trip. The trunk rattled with snacks, playlists shuffled between classic rock and folk, and we stopped constantly — at Pancake Bay to walk the long sandy beach and of course at the towering Wawa Goose for the obligatory roadside photo.

Whether you're planning a night out in Sault Ste. Marie, exploring Bruce Mines, Blind River, Thessalon, Elliot Lake and Spanish along the North Channel of Lake Huron, or discovering northern treasures in Chapleau, Hornepayne, or Hearst, Algoma is like a choose-your-own-adventure on four wheels: every sign pointing to a "scenic lookout" is an invitation you should take.

## TOURING BY MOTORCYCLE

If RVs are about comfort, motorcycles are about thrill. I'll never forget pulling into Old Woman Bay, cliffs towering over the bike, Superior pounding the shore. Every bend in the road delivered something new: pine forests, rocky bluffs, sudden glimpses of water so vast it looked like the sea. On two wheels, Algoma is immediate. The smell of pine needles, the cool rush of air in valleys, even Superior's mist clinging to your visor — it's all part of the ride.

The Grand Algoma Tour is one of Ontario's finest rides, a mix of sweeping shoreline curves and rolling inland stretches and the twists and turns of Highway 129.

## TOURING BY SNOWMOBILE

Most people think of Algoma in summer or fall, but winter is when the region feels truly wild. On a snowmobile, frozen rivers become highways, trails wind through forests, and lakes lies locked beneath ice.

Snowmobiling in Algoma offers a perfect mix of excitement, peace and welcome: from the sound of snowmobiles on trails to the quiet under snow-covered pines and the hospitality of Algoma communities.

Looking back, each trip felt like meeting Algoma all over again. In a car, I discovered its highlights. In an RV, I lingered longer. On a motorcycle, I felt every curve. And in winter, on a snowmobile, I saw a side of Algoma few experience.

That's Algoma's magic: no matter how you travel, it always finds a way to surprise you.





# Snowmobiling

## DISTRICT 15

### MISSINAIBI EXPEDITION TOUR

This tour takes snowmobile tourists along the Missinaibi River and through the woodlands north of Mattice and Hearst. The Missinaibi River was the main route from Lake Superior to the James Bay during fur trade times.

### THE BOBCAT LOOP

Upon arriving in Hornepayne, many riders will want to stay for a day or two and ride the local trails. Explore the gorgeous scenery of the north and keep an eye out for local wildlife.

## DISTRICT 13

### NORTH SHORE TOUR

Magnificent views and rugged scenery are a superb highlight of the North Shore Ride. It winds through many snowmobile-friendly communities before becoming a breathtaking wilderness adventure through the Algoma Highlands.

### SOO HIGHLANDS LOOP

Explore the natural beauty of the Soo Highlands Loop just north of Sault Ste. Marie. This day loop provides the perfect way to experience the rugged landscapes that the Algoma Highlands has to offer as you snowmobile through the breathtaking winter scenery.

### ISLAND GETAWAY LOOP

Enjoy scenic vistas over Lake Huron's North Shore. This side loop on St. Joseph Island lets you explore the trails on the island and staging areas with full amenities make up this exciting trip.

## THE COASTAL TRAIL

A strenuous hiking adventure, the Coastal Trail (63 km, or 5 to 7 days) traces Lake Superior along scenic cliffs, across cobblestone beaches, and vast forests. Several access points give you a choice of spending one or several days on the trail.

## CHAPLEAU GAME PRESERVE


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
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# Paddling

Marie, then east along Lake Huron to Sudbury, offering a varied terrain of paved and gravel country roads, Highway 17 and local trail systems. Connect to St. Joseph Island to cycle 70 km along the country roads. Stay overnight, ride the trails, and visit unique attractions and restaurants. Explore some of Algoma Country's scenic lookout stops: Elliot Lake Fire Tower, Chippewa Falls, Old Woman Bay, and Scenic High Falls. These scenic stops showcase the unique spirit of Northern Ontario, from towering cliffs and rushing waterfalls to calm, glassy shores.

## PADDLING ADVENTURES

Algoma's waterways are a must-paddle destination. From the calm, scenic beauty of inland lakes like Robertson Lake to the powerful shoreline of Lake Superior with local guided services, the region offers endless opportunities to get out on the water.



## HIKING ALONG LAKE HURON

The southern stretch of Algoma offers small-town charm with shoreline adventures. In Blind River, the Boom Camp Trails wind through old-growth forests and wetlands, offering 12 km of hiking options. A short drive east, the Thessalon Coastal Trail follows the Lake Huron shoreline, offering endless panoramic water views that never disappoint.

Foster Parkland and Walking Trails offer an easy loop that begins in a wildflower field, leading to incredible views. For a mix of history and exploration, the Bruce Mines Historic Mine Trail takes you through remnants of Ontario's first copper mine. The Ojibway Park Trail in Garden River First Nation rounds out this stretch, surrounding you in tall pines and rich cultural roots.

## ALONG LAKE SUPERIOR

As you drive up to Lake Superior Provincial Park, stop and hike Roberson Cliffs for unforgettable rushing water views; it truly offers the best. Haviland Lookout features a waterfall hike that leads to a lookout, making it the perfect spot for sunset.

The Lake Superior coast is where rugged landscapes meet small-town hospitality, creating endless opportunities for exploration. Pancake Bay and Batchawana Bay Provincial Parks boast long stretches of golden-sand beaches, while the Edmund Fitzgerald Lookout Trail rewards hikers with sweeping views over Superior's vast blue waters. Farther north, Lake Superior Provincial Park offers a wide range of hiking trails for every skill level, each revealing a different layer of the region's untamed beauty.

## THE HEART OF ALGOMA: HIDDEN INLAND GEMS

Heading inland leads to waterfalls, lookouts, and trails that feel off the beaten path. Aubrey Falls Provincial Park is a must-visit highlight, with a powerful cascade surrounded by rock formations and misty air. Near Thessalon, the Rock Candy Lookout rewards hikers with a sweeping view of the lake below. In Mississagi Provincial Park, the Helenbar Trail winds through the forest and over rocky ridges, offering a rewarding experience and view.

Whether you are drawn to the rugged Great Lakes coastlines or the serene solitude of the inland forests, Algoma offers a trail for every kind of explorer.





# Provincial Parks

## THE SCENIC PARKS OF ALGOMA

Experience the stunning scenery and range of adventures in Algoma's provincial parks: Lake Superior's rugged coastline, stories of shipwrecks, the forests of the ancient Penokean Mountains, centuries-old canoe routes and hiking trails leading to magnificent panoramic views. These provincial parks protect the natural and cultural heritage of Ontario.



### LAKE SUPERIOR PROVINCIAL PARK



Experience the exciting Algoma landscape painted by the Group of Seven, by hiking any of the park's 11 trails. The challenging Coastal Trail traverses the rugged headlands and rocky beaches of Lake Superior. Canoeists can choose from 7 canoe routes.



### PANCAKE BAY PROVINCIAL PARK



On the shores of Lake Superior, this park boasts 3 km (1.8 mi) of sandy beach and interpretive trails like the *Edmund Fitzgerald* Lookout with views of Lake Superior, and fantastic fall colours. The park is located along historic paddling routes of the voyageurs.



### BATCHAWANA BAY PROVINCIAL PARK



This day-use park is a great place to relax on the sandy beach, enjoy a picnic lunch in a picturesque setting, or launch a kayak for a short paddle on this stunning stretch of the lake.



## WHITE LAKE PROVINCIAL PARK



Situated on a 6,500-hectare lake, White Lake is a premier fishing spot for Walleye and Pike. The park is an ideal base for exploration with 3 nature trails to explore, sandy beaches and fantastic swimming.



## POTHOLES PROVINCIAL PARK



A day-use park on the Kinniwbabi River, east of Wawa on Hwy 101. A short trail through a garden-like setting leads to distinctive "potholes" in the bedrock, formed by glacial meltwaters 10,000 years ago.



## MISSISSAGI PROVINCIAL PARK



Home to the 130 m high Helenbar Lookout and 40 km of outstanding hiking trails that pass through a variety of landscapes and forests, with views of the Penokean Hills. Several lakes provide canoeing, boating and Trout fishing.



## NAGAGAMISIS PROVINCIAL PARK



Cree for "lake with fine sandy shores", this secluded lake is a favourite fishing spot for Walleye and Pike. The park is at the heart of an ancient glacial landscape of clear blue lakes. The Boreal Forest here is home to the elusive Woodland Caribou.



## MISSINAIBI PROVINCIAL PARK



Missinaibi is a Canadian Heritage River known for outstanding recreation, natural and cultural heritage. Both a huge lake surrounded by the largest game preserve in the world, and a 450 km-long heritage river, Missinaibi provides fishing, boating, canoeing, car and backcountry camping.



## IVANHOE LAKE PROVINCIAL PARK



Ivanhoe Lake is a great family camping park and a premier boating and fishing spot. The park includes the east half of Ivanhoe Lake and 20 km of the Ivanhoe River, with a great shallow sandy beach, great birding, excellent boating and great fishing for Walleye and Pike.



## FUSHIMI LAKE PROVINCIAL PARK



A quiet park known for its excellent Pike and Walleye fishing and surrounds the clear waters of Fushimi Lake. It has great swimming at one of the half-dozen sandy beaches scattered around its shores, shore lunch spots for fish fries, and some backcountry campsites.

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

## ROAD TRIP ALONG LAKE HURON

Travelling across Lake Huron's North Shore is an iconic Algoma Country experience. A region rich in history, arts, culture, and culinary experiences, its small communities have plenty to explore. Discover some of the amazing cultural gems on Lake Huron's North Shore, all surrounded by stunning Canadian scenery.

### SERPENT RIVER

A must-stop on any road trip along the scenic North Shore is the popular Serpent River Trading Post. Located on the Trans-Canada Highway in Serpent River First Nation, this well-known Anishinaabe trading post is the perfect place to stop, shop, and snack. Peruse authentic and beautiful Indigenous arts and crafts, and load up on road trip essentials like fudge, beef jerky, ice cream, and locally caught pickerel and chips.

If you are passing through Serpent River First Nation on the weekend following the August Civic Holiday, make sure to attend the Genaabaaajiing Traditional Pow Wow, one of the largest cultural gatherings on the North Shore. A beautiful celebration of the Anishinabek community's deep connection to the land. Soak in the vibrant atmosphere with inspiring drummers and dancers, shop for unique Indigenous arts and crafts, and enjoy traditional food under the summer sun.



## BLIND RIVER

The town of Blind River is home to the Timber Village Museum, a small but important spot to learn about the rich history of the area. Explore archeological artifacts and historical photographs from the First Nations People of the region, and learn how the logging and lumbering industry transformed the region.

Art lovers will want to take a peek at the Timber Village Museum Art Gallery. Bursting with creative and unique art pieces from local artists, you can pick up beautiful items like intricate woodwork, inspiring photographs, and spectacular paintings depicting the dynamic landscape of the region.

For the perfect evening, dine riverside at Blind River's local sports bar to watch the sunset over a juicy steak, pub classics, or a local brew.

## THESSALON

A cherished event in the small town of Thessalon is the Summerfest Classic Car and Bike Show, taking place every August in Peach Park. Snap selfies alongside cool vintage and classic cars, browse the artisan market for fun finds, and enjoy live music and great food in this quaint lakeside community.

## BRUCE MINES

## ST. JOSEPH ISLAND

Once a thriving community of soldiers, Indigenous peoples, and fur traders during the early 1800s, Fort St. Joseph National Historic Site is bursting with history. Learn about the important alliance between the British and First Nations People during the war of 1812, explore the historic ruins, try your hand at firing a musket, and hike the grounds overlooking the St. Marys River.

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

For a family activity, the boardwalk is a send-off point to the 22.5 km Hub Trail city loop, a walking or biking path that circles the city, passing many great stops along the way.

Visit in the winter for some of the best cross-country skiing in North America, plus nearby Searchmont Resort has some of the highest vertical downhill skiing in the area. Sault Ste. Marie's downtown comes alive



in the winter with the beautiful Clergue Park ice-skating rink, and there are also countless opportunities for snowshoeing and popular fat biking throughout the city.

Visitors can also take in downtown attractions aboard the New Big Ben Double Decker hop-on hop-off bus, a unique way to explore the city.




## WHITE RIVER







# Know Before You Go



## CROSSING THE CANADA-U.S. BORDER

All U.S. citizens aged 16 and older, entering Canada by air (including in-transit passengers who are transferring planes in the U.S.), land or water, must present one of the following documents: a passport or passport card; an Enhanced Driver's Licence; or a Trusted Traveler Program Card (SENTRI, NEXUS or FAST Card). Travellers aged 15 and under require a birth certificate for land or sea travel and a passport for air travel. For current requirements go to: [ircc.canada.ca](http://ircc.canada.ca)

If you are travelling with your own children under the age of 16 and your spouse, bring their birth certificates. If you are travelling with a child other than your own or without your spouse, have the child's birth certificate along with a letter of permission, including name and contact info for that child's parents/guardians or your spouse. This is needed in case Customs Officers decide to verify you have permission to bring the child into Canada. Visitors from all other countries require a valid passport and, in some cases, a visitor visa. Starting March 15, 2016, visa-exempt foreign nationals who fly to or transit through Canada will need an Electronic Travel Authorization (ETA). Exceptions include U.S. citizens and travellers with a valid visa.

## RESIDENTS RETURNING TO THE U.S.

If you're a U.S. resident visiting Canada for less than 48 hours, you can bring back \$200 worth of goods duty-free. For stays longer than 48 hours, the duty-free limit rises to \$800, but this \$800 limit can only be used once every 30 days. If you return for another shopping trip in less than 30 days and have already purchased \$800 worth of goods, your limit drops to \$200. People who live in the same house can combine their duty-free limits, but they must travel together. Refer to:

## IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR U.S. RESIDENTS

If you or anyone in your party has a felony or misdemeanour conviction, you may not be allowed into Canada. This includes such offences as a DUI. Your admissibility to Canada depends on the nature of the offence, how many offences you have, as well as how long ago it occurred. If this applies to you or someone travelling with you, it is imperative you contact Immigration Canada well in advance of your arrival. You will likely have to complete some paperwork and Immigration Canada authorities will then advise you of the likelihood of being allowed into Canada. The final determination of your admissibility into Canada is only made when you cross the border.

## WHAT CAN & CAN'T COME INTO CANADA

Residents of the United States who visit Canada are allowed to bring in a "reasonable" amount of personal goods duty-free. The amount you bring should align with your length of stay. There are limits for some of the regulated items: Alcohol, tobacco and food products. What is and what is not allowed changes frequently -- for up to date info visit [inspection.canada.ca](http://inspection.canada.ca) for current information prior to your departure.

**PETS:** Dogs and cats accompanying their owners from the U.S. must have current (within 36 months) rabies vaccination certificates & appear healthy. Owners from other countries who wish to bring their pets with them should contact **1-800-442-2342 / (613) 225-2342** / TTY **1-800-465-7735** or visit [inspection.canada.ca](http://inspection.canada.ca)

## VEHICLES AND INSURANCE

Any necessary permits are issued at the port of entry. If you've rented a vehicle or trailer, make sure you bring along a copy of the rental contract, which stipulates that you have permission to use it in Canada. U.S. motorists planning to travel in Canada are advised to obtain a Canadian Non-Resident Inter-provincial Motor Vehicle Liability Insurance Card available only in the U.S. Contact your local insurance agency. ## HOSPITALS & HEALTH INSURANCE

Most communities have hospitals and/or resident doctors. Wise travellers will check with their medical service plans to ensure they will be covered while in Canada, as health insurance plans may not extend coverage outside your country of residence. If you are taking prescription drugs, make sure that they are in the original packaging, bring an adequate supply, and bring a copy of the prescription in case you need a refill during your stay in Ontario.

If this is not possible, carry a copy of the prescription or a letter from your doctor. For more information and insurance details, contact your travel agent, insurance broker, or your employer's insurance provider.

## SEAT BELTS

Ontario Law requires that adults and children over 40 lbs / 18 kg in weight wear seat belts. Infants from birth to 20 lbs / 9 kg in weight must travel in a rear-facing child restraint system. Toddlers weighing 20 - 40 lbs / 9 - 18 kg must travel in a forward or rear-facing child restraint seat.

## CREDIT CARDS, FINANCIAL SERVICES AND U.S. FUNDS

Chartered banks are located in virtually all cities and towns. These full-service institutions are the best locations for exchanging currency. There is also a government-sanctioned Canada / U.S. currency exchange service at the International Bridge Plaza in Sault Ste. Marie and at the Duty-Free Store & Kiosk. Credit cards such as Visa, MasterCard and AMEX, are generally honoured in all communities. Be sure to check with individual businesses before or when booking accommodations to ensure they accept your card.

## SALES TAX

In Ontario, a Harmonized Sales Tax (HST) of 13% applies to most purchases. For more information, contact:

## BOATERS - HOW TO REPORT YOUR ENTRY

Pleasure crafts may enter Canada by trailer or under their own power. All boats powered by motors 10 HP or over must be licenced. Boat licences from outside Ontario are accepted. Operator Competency Requirements for Pleasure Craft – Regulation requires that all operators of motorized pleasure crafts have proof of competency and proof of age on board at all times. An operator card or equivalent, issued to a non-resident by their state or country, will be considered as proof of competency.

Planning to "land" your vessel on Canadian soil or did you leave Canadian waters and land on U.S. soil? All private boaters who intend to land on Canadian soil, or who have departed Canadian waters and landed on U.S. soil, are required to report to a CBSA designated marine reporting site. Upon arrival at this designated site, call the Telephone Reporting Centre at **1-888-226-7277** from the phone provided to obtain clearance. Not planning to "land" your vessel or did you leave Canadian waters but did not land on U.S. soil? You still need to report to the CBSA. ## FISHING REGULATIONS

• **Licences:** All non-residents of Canada who want to fish in Ontario require a current non-resident sports fishing licence and a non-resident Outdoors Card. Non-residents under the age of 18 may fish without a licence if accompanied by a licenced family member. Any fish caught are part of the limit of the person with the licence. Canadian residents require a resident fishing licence and a current resident Outdoors Card.

• **Bait:** You cannot bring live minnows, smelts, leeches or any other bait fish into Ontario from the United States. Night crawlers are allowed but they must be brought in containers with artificial bedding only.

• **Limits and Regulations:** With countless lakes and streams, it is important that anglers are aware of the general regulations and of any exceptions to the general regulations (e.g. specific slots or catch and possession limits) that may apply to the lake you will be fishing. ## HUNTING REGULATIONS

Non-residents must have one of the following to obtain a hunting licence:

- 1) An Ontario non-resident hunting licence issued to you after January 1, 1968.
- 2) A hunting licence issued to you after January 1, 1968 by a competent authority in a jurisdiction where you were a resident of that jurisdiction.
- 3) An Ontario hunting licence verification certificate showing your licence to hunt in Ontario or that you passed the hunting license examination.

## FIREARMS INFORMATION

Residents of the U.S. over the age of 18 may bring a hunting rifle or shotgun into Ontario for hunting purposes. You are also allowed to bring up to 200 rounds of ammunition duty-free, or up to 1,500 rounds for use at a recognized competition. Firearms are subject to a registration fee. It is suggested that you contact the Canada Firearms Centre for information before you attempt to import a firearm. Residents of the U.S. are encouraged to pre-register their firearms prior to arriving. Handguns, fully automatic weapons, modified weapons, stun guns, mace and other weapons are not allowed in Canada. Proper storage of the firearm is important so make sure you are aware of the regulations. Of special note, firearms of any kind are forbidden in many of Canada's National and Provincial Parks and adjacent areas.
